He said extended producer responsibility had also been introduced under which the discretion will be with the local bodies and thus for the first time, the producers (i.e persons engaged in manufacture, or import of carry bags, multi-layered packaging and sheets or like and the per-

bags/plastic sheets/multi-layered packaging in to commodity supply chain were primarily the retailers and street vendors.

He said they had been assigned the responsibility of not to provide the commodities in plastic bags/plastic sheets/multi-layered packaging which do not conform to these rules. Otherwise, they will have to pay the fine.
