

The project coordinator said that pollution reduction in the tanning processes has been reduced by 20-30 per cent on different parameters. He said many tanneries had started adopting these practices in their manufacturing.

Pandey said recently, the UNIDO project had organised a study tour to Turkey for tanneries and government authorities. He said what was learnt from the study tour on development of eco-tannery zones and waste management in tanneries was being evaluated and implemented in the project activities. The objective of the workshop was to develop a typical tannery design as a template to provide technical inputs for tanneries to organise the production. Quite often, the existing layout of tanneries become an impediment in practising newer tanning technologies, implementing improved methods in occupational health and safety or improve the productivity. Pandey said proper layout of the tanneries was the need of the hour.

Inaugurating the workshop, Uttar Pradesh Leather Industries Association president Anwarul Haq said that the topic of the workshop was very relevant to the tanneries. He said the foremost aspect was appropriateness of layout for adoption of cleaner technologies, the second important aspect was to adopt safety provisions and thirdly the efficiency in productivity, high productive layouts in view of increasing cost of labour, and finally inventory as the cost of inventory was considerably high in many tanneries, quite often attributable to the type of machineries available.

UNIDO KLDP national project coordinator M Viswanathan said that the template tannery design would incorporate all possibilities of cleaner tanning technologies, safety provisions to meet international standards, better and easier material handling equipment, modern machinery to produce high quality leather and increased productivity.

He said the designs were specific to Kanpur tanneries considering local factors such as type of raw material and finished leather. Antonio Belleri and Ralph Arbeid from Huni, Switzerland presented the draft tannery design prepared by them and took note of the comments of the industry representatives. The final design will be presented within a month.
