

Land shark hatching conspiracy to secure possession of houses

Over a dozen residents of Om Purwa, Chakeri, have alleged a local land mafiaso for hatching conspiracy with the Special Police Officer (SPO) and agents of Tehsil to secure possession on their houses.

Talking to mediapersons, one of the victims Ramdin said the land mafiaso and goon Abdul Jabbar and his accomplices Munna Toap alias Jaffar and Fudush were terrorising them to handover possession of their houses to him on the basis of fake documents filed with the Nagar Nigam and Revenue department etc. Victims said that they had been residing there on their ancestral properties for the past several decades and holding sufficient proof of ownership. They had already lodged complaint with the District Magistrate, ACM, ASP Cantonment, Land Mafia portal and Tehsil but nothing has been done so far. They said that Abdul Jabbar had set up the Jabbar Nagar by forcibly securing possession on the land in Chandra Nagar, Khalwa, and selling it in small plots. He also forcibly secured possession on Jagriti School, Ompurwa, and divided it in small plots. He had also

secured possession on various other properties on the basis of his muscle power and terror among the residents of Ompurwa. They had met the State Cabinet Minister Satish Mahana on whose directives to the senior administration and police authorities also failed to make any impact on the land mafiaso. Sanjay Kumar, Ram Lal, Chandan Kumar and Ram Gopal were also present at the press conference.

YOUTH KILLED: A youth was gruesomely killed, under the Panki police station on Tuesday night. His body with crushed head was recovered from the Nagar Nigam park in Site No.2, Panki Industrial Area, on Wednesday morning. As there were two holes on his head, police apprehended that the youth was shot dead. Sniffer dog went up to a factory where from police took a suspect into custody. Residents informed that most of the factory workers and labourers used to sleep in this park at night. Pawan (24) son of Suraj Pal of Daulatpur, Ghatampur Kotwali, was employed as a labourer here. On Wednesday morning, he was found dead in Kashiram Park of Panki Industrial Area Site No.2. His head, bearing two holes, was crushed with

some heavy object. Later, he appeared to have been shot dead. Local police along with the field unit reached the spot. Contractor Nandu Singh of Gujaini identified the deceased as Pawan. He said Pawan was youngest among his three brothers. The name of his eldest brother was Harnam. Circle Officer Ajay Kumar said investigations were on in the matter. Sniffer dog went up to a slipper manufacturing unit wherefrom police took a suspect into custody.

Meanwhile, a Picup driver was killed when a roadways bus (UP79 T6620) collided head on with his vehicle near Dubiyani crossing, under the Shivrajpur police station on Wednesday.
