She said improvement in adolescent immunisation coverage in India, will require strengthening of healthcare delivery system and also require significant improvements in the healthcare functionaries ability and willingness to provide and deliver vaccines to adolescents. She added that vaccine coverage in adolescents was inadequate because in general they had less contact with physicians than

Youth killed over petty dispute

KANPUR: A youth was mysteriously killed in Bandraha village, under the Rasoolabad police station in Kanpur Dehat on Saturday night. After killing him, the body was dumped on the bank of a canal where his friend was also found in unconscious state. The cause of incident was stated to be a petty dispute during a dinner party with other friends organised near a poultry farm. Police recovered the blood-stained brick, iron rod and axe along with 14 empty quarters of the liquor. The utensil used for cooking the fish was also recovered from the spot. The deceased was identified as Santosh alias Sintu whose palms were found laced with wheat flour. His friend Lal Bahadur in unconscious state was found having a piece of bread in his palm. SP (Dehat) Radhey Shyam Vishwakarma reached the spot and sent the injured Lal Bahadur to L.R. Hospital. Villagers informed that the poultry farm of Asharam Yadav was lying closed for the past six years. On Saturday night, deceased Santosh alias Sintu, Lal Bahadur had gone to organise a liquor and dinner party with Jaikaran, Raju, Premchandra, Dipak, Rinku, Putai and Chandrapal. On Sunday morning, Santosh alias Sintu was found dead on the bank of the canal, about 200 metres away from the poultry farm, along with Lal Bahadur in unconscious state. Police also recovered a bed sheet and a rug from the spot. SO Sushil Kumar Singh said the body was sent for autopsy. He took

Premchandra, Dipak, Raju, Rinku, Jaikaran of Bandraha village, Vikram and Bablu of Meghal village, Suraj and Ravi of Tirwa village into custody for interrogation and claimed to workout the murder case soon. He informed that Suraj and Ravi had arrived here at their maternal uncle Ramlakhan's place. Dipak is their maternal cousin.

PRADHAN'S SON RAPES MINOR GIRL: The son of a gram pradhan raped a minor Dalit girl in a village, under the Sachendi police station on Sunday morning. Not only this, he also bit on several parts of her body and caused injury. The girl anyhow rescued herself and apprised her family members about the incident. On the complaint of her family members, police lodged the report and have arrested the guilty youth. According to reports, Dinesh Vishwakarma is the gram pradhan of Sidhi village in Sachendi. His son Gyan Prakash Verma raped a minor Dalit girl on Sunday morning. On protest, he brutally beat up the girl and bit on several parts of her body. There were also marks of injury on her body. Initially, the local police took the incident in the lighter vein and seemed in favour of the guilty youth. But, with the issue coming into knowledge of media, police lodged a report against the guilty youth and arrested him.
