

He said NLP was initially devised to help in therapy which was why it was regularly used to cure phobias, decrease anxiety, reduce stress and overcome neuroses.

He said the ability to identify the ways that people were thinking and feeling and ethically make changes in those states also made it ideal for business.

He said it was a psychological approach that involved analysing strategies used by successful individuals and applying them to reach a personal goal and related thoughts, language, and patterns of behaviour learned through experience to specific outcomes.

He said proponents of NLP assumed all human action was positive and thus if a plan failed or the unexpected happened, the experience was neither good nor bad it simply presented more useful information.

Dr Kumar said modeling, action, and effective communications were key elements of neuro-linguistic programming and the belief was that if an individual can understand how another person accomplished a task, the process may be copied and communicated to others so they too can accomplish the

task.

He said similarly proponents of neuro-linguistic programming proposed that everyone had a personal map of reality and those who practiced NLP analysed their own and other perspectives to create a systematic overview of one situation.

He said by understanding a range of perspectives, the NLP user gained information and said advocates of this school of thought believed the senses were vital for processing available information and that the body and mind influenced each other.

He said neuro-linguistic programming was an experiential approach and thus if a person wanted to understand an action, they must perform that same action to learn from the experience.

He said those who practices NLP believed there were natural hierarchies of learning,

communication, and change. He said there were six logical levels of change.

He said first being purpose and spirituality and this was the highest level of change and close to follow was Identity which included ones responsibilities and the roles one played in life.

He said the third was beliefs and values which mattered and the fourth was capabilities and skills as to what one can do.

He said in addition to this the fifth was behaviour which was in fact specific action one performed and last but not the least was environment which was ones context or setting, including any other people around.

He said this was the lowest level of change. He added that the purpose of each logical level was to organise and direct the information so making a change in a lower level

may cause changes in a higher level.

Dr Kumar said NLP therapists worked with people to understand their thinking and behavioural patterns, emotional state, and aspirations and by examining a person's map, the therapist can help them find and strengthen the skills that served them best and assisted them in developing new strategies to replace unproductive ones.

He said this process can help individuals in therapy reach treatment goals.

He said since its creation, neuro-linguistic programming had been used to treat a wide range of issues like anxiety, phobias, and panic, communication issues, post traumatic stress, depression, attention-deficit hyperactivity, addiction, schizophrenia, obsessions and compulsions and finally borderline personality.

Health camp organised

KANPUR: A free health check-up camp was organised at Dabouli Durga Mandir by Aarog Dham Society on Saturday. Dr Hemant Mohan and Dr Aarti Mohan dealt with the patients suffering from dengue. Dr Hemant said that Aarog Dham Society has been organising such events to cure people of infectitious and viral-borne diseases. Dr Mohan informed that number of patients also came for treatment of Chikenguiniya and joint pain. He said that homeopathic medicines improves the immunity and increases the vitality of the patients. He said that the main aim of Aarog Dham Society is to prevent and cure people of various diseases. He said it aims that there should not be any death due to dengue fever. Earlier in the morning the camp was inaugurated by Surendra Maithani, MLA Govind Nagar and he appreciated the efforts of the Aarog Dham Society and said that the society is working for the welfare of the people. The camp started early in the morning at 8 am and continued till 12 pm. The doctors advised patients to wear full sleeves clothes and prevent themselves from the mosquitoes.

Dr Shamli Gupta, Dr Saumya Agarwal, Dr RP Mohan were also present in the camp. Anoop Tiwari from BJP, Dr Vinay Mishra, Manish Awasthi and others were present in the camp.
